



Construction Continues on Turtle Mountain

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Vernon, British Columbia - Wesbild Holdings Ltd., is continuing their construction program on Vernon's newest residential community, Turtle Mountain, with Phase II commencing today.

Working closely with their contractors, Hoban Equipment Ltd and consulting engineers Kerr Wood Leidal, Phase II will see the completion of a layout for the first subdivision, further road grading of Turtle Mountain Drive and site grading for the first 95 single family lots as well as for a pump station and reservoir.
